Well done to our Stars of the Week and Team Player Penguins who received a certificate in our Celebration Assembly.






Consent Booklets and Birth Certificates

All children in School (Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) need to carefully read the Consent Booklet and return it duly signed to their class teacher. This is a very important document due to new legislation concerning sharing of personal information. We also need to have sight of Birth Certificates if you have not already done so.



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Scholastic Book Fair

The Scholastic Book Fair is returning in the school library outside the hall on the week commencing **Monday 8th October**. This is a great opportunity for you to buy new books for your child and also help to raise funds for the school. On Monday and Wednesday during Parents Evening it will be open from 3.30-6.00pm and the other nights of the week from 3.30-4.00pm.

Private Fostering

Are you looking after someone else's child? Is your child living with another family? If the answer to either question is yes, and the arrangement is for 28 days or more, this is known as Private Fostering. If a child or young person under 16 years old (or 18 if they have a disability) is looked after by someone who is not a close relative, then by law Devon County Council need to be informed. When notified, we will work with the child, parents and private foster carers to ensure the best possible arrangements are in place for the child.

Flu Vaccination

The nasal flu vaccine will be given on **Thursday 15**th **November 2018** to those children who hand in their consent form before the deadline. www.nhs.uk/vaccinations



The children's flu vaccine is offered as a yearly nasal spray to young children to help protect them against flu.

How is the nasal spray flu vaccine given?

The vaccine is given as a single spray squirted up each nostril. Not only is it needle-free – a big advantage for children – the nasal spray is quick, painless, and works even better than the injected flu vaccine. The vaccine is absorbed very quickly. It will still work even if, after the vaccination, your child develops a runny nose, sneezes or blows their nose.

Flu can be a very unpleasant illness for children, with potentially serious complications.
