**Illness** - When children are ill we often get asked about when they can come back to school. We use the Devon guidance about this. I hope this table will help you if you are in doubt about what to do.

Illness	Exclusion period
Temperature	Until the temperature is in the normal range
Sickness	24 hours off school after the last bout
Sickness and diarrhoea	48 hours off school after the last bout
Head lice	Absence from school not necessary
Chicken pox	Until scabs are dry (minimum of 5 days)
Measles	6 days from onset of the rash
Conjunctivitis	Until eyes stop weeping
Mumps	5 days from onset of swelling

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### Friendship Week

Next week is our Federation Friendship Week. The children will be learning about the importance of friendship, how to be a good friend, and what to do if friendships go wrong.

As it is also National Anti-Bullying Week, at the Junior School we are also going to do some work on bullying, particularly looking at:

- What is bullying?
- How can children stop bullying from happening?
- What they should do if they are being bullied.

On Wednesday Childline came into Assembly to talk to Year 5 and 6 about their work. They described bullying as 'behaviour and happens **Several Times On Purpose'**, which for us and yourselves to use with the children.

During the week the children will learn about:

- Physical bullying
- Emotional bullying
- eSafety and appropriate use of social media
- Racism
- Tolerance and respect to all groups and individuals

Another key message from the Childline Assembly was that if children are worried about anything they should **S**tart **T**elling **O**ther **P**eople. They were able to identify lots of adults in and out of school that they could talk to, which was very reassuring.

It will help your child if you are able to talk to them about work they are doing this week.
