Parking

We have been seeking support in improving the safety of the roads around our school. A road safety officer has been working with our local councillor, the police and the council and the following advice has been given so that all our children and families get to and from school safely:

1. *Park away from the main entrances of the school and not to stop on double yellow lines at all.*
2. *Avoid reversing into Ladysmith Road from the side roads as it is at the entrances to these roads that children tend to cross.*



The enforcement officers have been visiting the roads around the school and have been giving out parking tickets, so we have emailed a map to help you locate parking spaces in the immediate vicinity. If you are able to, using public transport, walking and cycling also benefit health levels and the environment.
