What makes the Big Wild Sleep Out Unique?

- Exclusive access to some beautiful private areas of the RSPB Aylesbeare- camping is not usually
 allowed on Aylesbeare or anywhere on the Pebblebed Heaths* in order to protect the important
 wildlife there so this is a unique opportunity to spend a night out in the wild. (* We are allowed to
