You may have heard in the local media about a new initiative called "School Streets" which is when a road outside a school is temporarily closed to motor vehicles. This opens the street up to families on foot, bike or scooter and enables social distancing to take place. Our scheme will cover Pretoria Road and Claremont Road (The road off Ladysmith Road, leading to the Junior School entrance) and we are looking for volunteers to take on the role of 'School Street Operatives'. Those offering to volunteer will be trained and will receive a high visibility jacket to wear when the scheme is in operation: between 8.35 and 9.05 in the morning and 2.50 and 3.40 after school.


Parents Evenings
