#### Liva's trip to Uganda



Liya led an assembly on Wednesday with her mum to talk about the time she spent in Uganda earlier this year. She was travelling with her mum who is working with schools around Uganda to improve access to education for some of the staggering 61 million primary aged children who do not go to school. During the visit, Liya met the Secretary for Education! Here are a few extracts from the diary she kept during the trip:



'The next day it was International Women's Day and everyone was off work, it was a holiday for one day. We went on a boda boda and had a look round Kampala.

The boda bodas are really fun but you need to wear a helmet.

My mummy did a work shop on Thursday and she had a microphone and stood in front of government people. She presented her ideas in a confident voice and she told them about the things that she found out about Ugandan schools. I helped my mummy by quickly handing out her business cards.

We saw a lot of animals including lions, elephants and giraffes. We also saw

baboons and one stole a lady's lunch! In the afternoon, we went on a boat ride to a waterfall on the Nile and we saw lots of hippos and crocodiles.'

'On Monday I went to a Ugandan school and I learnt



converting Roman numerals to Arabic numerals and that was my maths lesson. After that I did an English lesson after we had our break like usual. It was very hot but I still had a lot of fun.'







It sounded like an incredible adventure and an experience she won't ever forget. It was great to see the room which is to become their school library. Liya's mum is sending over 8 boxes of books from Ladysmith Junior School which we no longer needed. Thanks again to Liya and her mum for sharing their adventures with us.
