#### **Governors' Annual Report 2020**

The 2019/20 academic year got off to a very successful start for both of the schools within the Ladysmith Federation. Both schools made excellent progress on developing their existing wider curriculum, without compromising core subjects, in line with the change of emphasis of OFSTED to quality of education rather than a reliance purely on SATS results. Both schools, prior to Covid-19, continued to invite parents in to school, the infant school with its Partnership for Parents and the Junior school with parent curriculum workshops.

The Federation provides many enrichment activities which could not have happened without the support of Children, Parents and Teachers Together (CPTT) whose involvement and fundraising activities make a huge difference to both schools. Many thanks to everyone involved and keep up the good work.

2019-2020 has been a year where the whole school community has been incredible in support of each other. This has benefited the children in what is an unpredictable time and unprecedented time.

Both schools have benefited from their involvement with the River Exe Learning Partnership (RELP). This is a group of similar schools within the local area that have a similar ethos, who work together to share good practice and to ensure continuing improvement in the education that they provide. RELP has been of particular value during the current pandemic giving staff opportunities to share concerns.

#### **Ladysmith Infant & Nursery School**

At the start of the year the Infant and Nursery school continued its journey to increase opportunities for children to become independent in their learning. From Nursery to Year Two, children's interests have increasingly been the driver for the learning that happens across the school. Teachers and staff are excited about the next steps as they continually extend the provision offered. Children have had greater access to the Forest School areas through the OPAL programme; play is rich and exciting and fitness levels have improved. The school site has been developed, with refurbished outside areas for Reception and Year One and baby trees forming a screen around the perimeter of the school.

Since lock down we have seen how brilliantly parents and staff have supported the children to continue learning, using Seesaw for the first time and developing Tapestry further. Support offered by the Family Support Worker has given families access to hampers from St Marks church and other agencies.

For the last four months we have missed having the whole school on site, but have been able to offer places to all key workers, all vulnerable pupils, all reception and nursery children. We have a "Recovery" curriculum under development ready for September, which has a focus on mental health and well-being, relationships and PSHE. We look forward to seeing everyone back in September, including 130 new children in Nursery and Reception.

#### Ladysmith Junior School

The ongoing development of the curriculum at the Junior School has been a positive feature this year and we are very much looking forward to building on this in September.

A substantial grant has been obtained to develop the reading bus on which work has already begun. There has been a continuation of the Grow Project and further development of the school grounds in order to provide an enriched environment for children to play and learn in. Many thanks to everyone involved.

Prior to lock down we have continued to offer a wide range of enrichment experiences across the school and luckily the Year 6 Beam House trip was able to take place.

Towards the end of term, we have been able to offer all the children the opportunity to say goodbye to their class and teacher in person. We have also been pleased that we have been able to offer a range of transition activities and that Year 6 have managed to complete a number of end of year celebration activities, such as the year book, leavers' hoodies and a celebration video.

Both schools operate on a fully inclusive equal opportunity basis and this is built into the policies and procedures that governors expect the schools to operate by. It is our responsibility to ensure that every child, irrespective of their needs, has the same opportunity to attain their full potential. Governors are fully updated on how identified needs are met. The schools also provide support and advice to parents.

Governors are volunteers who are working to support the schools and to ensure that they maintain the quality of provision that is expected for the children they educate. The governing body currently does not reflect the diversity of the school population so if you, or anyone you may know, are interested in becoming a governor and helping to support your schools please do get in touch to discuss this. In summary, 2019/20 has been a challenging year for both schools and the governors are extremely grateful to all of the staff for the hard work that they have put in to make this year successful. This task has not been getting any easier over the last few years because of budgetary pressures that have been put on Local Authorities and schools. Staff keep stepping up to ensure that all of the children get the opportunities that they require. However, it may be that in the coming year some major fund-raising may need to be undertaken to address some of the funding issues around building upkeep.

The Governors wish the children good luck when they move to their new classes or schools in September. Have a great summer holiday.
