#### **Accelerated Reader**





The library is now open again! The library has moved to the end of year 5 and is now fully operational again thanks to a huge amount of work by Mrs Murchison and Mr Hawkins. The children have been introduced to 'Accelerated Reader' which is a reading program we are using. The system encourages children to read books which are at an appropriate level for their understanding. They will be asked to choose books from within a specific range and then asked to complete a short, on-line quiz to check that they have understood the text. From this they earn points and the system records how many words they have read! The children will also be able to choose a 'free

choice', but this will not be recorded by Accelerated Reader. Once the system is up and running, we will invite parents in to find out more but in the meantime, all children should have an accelerated reader book and they will begin to take quizzes in school.
