### PE and Sport Premium Grant Annual Report 2016-17

#### **What is the sport premium grant?**

*The PE and Sport Premium Grant is an amount of funding from the government given either directly to schools or via local authorities. It is extra to the school budget. For schools with over 17 pupils it is based on a lump sum amount and then a smaller amount per pupil.*

#### **What are the aims of the PE and Sport Grant?**

*Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best of way using of the money.*

*For example, you can use your funding to:*

- *hire specialist PE teachers*
- *hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers*
- *provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport*
- *support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and [Change4Life](#) clubs*
- *run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the [School Games](#)*
- *run sports activities with other schools.*

#### **How much will the grant be for the academic year 2016/17?**

Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £8,000 and an additional payment of £5 per pupil.

This will be received in 2 payments; one in October 2016 and one in April 2017.

Projected amount Ladysmith will receive in 2016/17: £9 670

## During 2016-17 we will use the PE and sport grant in the following ways:

- Create an all-weather track around the school field and implement a mile-a-day golden mile into the curriculum.
- Develop the Forest School provision and embed this into the PE curriculum.
- Maintain and increase the number of children participating in regular sporting activity
- Continue to facilitate teams to compete in inter and intra school sport competition.
- To continue to be part of the School Sports Partnership with St Luke's Science and Sports College.
- Invest in teacher training courses
- Continue to ensure that all children can swim 25m.
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## Impact of the PE and Sport Grant in 2016-17:

- All weather running track built
- All pupils and staff completing daily Golden Mile within a timetabled slot.
- Recent assessment against baseline fitness test shows significant gains in stamina for all year groups
- Forest School Area partly developed with CPD booked in for summer term. Area to be further developed in the summer term
- Proportion of children participating in competitive sport maintained from previous years
- School Sports Partnership CPD used effectively
- New PE coordinator attendance at CPD
- CPD provided for all MTAs
- The proportion of children able to swim 25m has increased
