We will be looking at how to make wise and balanced choices about our goals, and how to go about setting and achieving them.




Learning Letters

At the end of last term we sent out our latest 'Learning Letters', outlining the work the children will be doing this half term. These are now on the school website if you missed them, or you can pick up a copy from the School Office.

As a brief reminder, here are our topics for this half term:

- Year 3 'Magnets and magnetism'. This will include lots of pirate-based work with treasure maps and compass directions, art work and pirate music.
- **Year 4** 'Batteries Included' looking at the different uses of electricity in the world around us
- **Year 5** 'Fire, Fever and Fashion' learning about life in 17th Century London, including the Plague and the Great Fire
- **Year 6** 'Ancient Civilizations' including China and the secrets of Stonehenge





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Playtime and lunchtime

Wherever possible we try to get the children outside into the playground at playtime and lunchtime. The children learn much more effectively, especially in the afternoons, if they have had a chance to let off steam and run around.

If it is raining heavily we keep them in, but the rest of the time we follow the Billy Connolly rule: 'there's no such thing as bad weather, only the wrong clothes'.

Please make sure your child has a suitable coat at school so that if it is a bit drizzly they don't get too wet when they're playing outside.

Can I also remind you that we ask the children to stick to fruit as a breaktime snack as part of our Healthy Schools programme.
