Kelso comes to Ladysmith Junior

Conflict or disagreement is normal and often happens when children get together. However, hurtful words, gestures, or physical attack are unacceptable ways to deal with conflict and disagreement at school.

We will be using the **Kelso's Choice** program to teach students several positive ways to deal with difficult situations. To do this, we are asking students who have **minor problems** to try at least two of the ideas from Kelso's Wheel of Choices before asking for adult help. We will be teaching them what the choices are and how to do this.



We will also be teaching them how to **recognise a major problem**, and how if they are in this situation they should **seek adult help straight away**.



By using this plan, our children will develop effective problemsolving skills that they can use again and again. It will help them to deal with conflict in a positive manner and to make appropriate decisions. Knowing what to do will help children reduce the stress and number of conflicts they have both in and out of school.

It will really help your child if you can talk to them about what

they have been learning – we started looking at the Wheel of Choices in assembly this week, and the teaching sessions start next week.

Willow Project – Volunteers Needed

As part of a larger project to improve the grounds of the Junior School, on **Thursday 29th and Friday 30th January** we will be planting willow to sculpt into a series of domes and tunnels that have been designed by the children. This will provide some much needed shade on the field as well as an interesting place to play. **Parents from both the Junior School and Infant School are invited to volunteer for a**
