Tree Planting

We were delighted to welcome Sir Harry Studholme (chairman of the Forestry Commission) to the Junior School last week to plant 50 new trees along the bank that runs parallel to Pretoria Road. Bill Blight, known affectionately by the children as Garth, kindly organised the event. Bill has worked with children at the Infant School for a number of years supporting their forest school work. We are lucky enough to also benefit from Bill's time and expertise. The new trees are a mix of mature varieties, amongst others including Rowans, Whitebeams and Oaks. They now form the 'Centenary Wood', so called in celebration of the centenary of the Forestry Commission, which was created in September 1919 in a bid to promote forestry and woodland across the country.

Sir Harry planted the first tree and then Mr Wilkinson, Mrs Brown, Mr Broad, Catherine (GROW) and Mrs Beecroft were invited to plant their own trees. The wildlife champions from both the Infant and Junior Schools then helped Mr Hawkins plant the remainder of the trees. Bill has kindly offered to donate some snow drops which will be planted around the base of each tree.

We would like to say a huge thankyou to Bill who has given a considerable amount of his time. We look forward to watching the newly formed Centenary Wood take shape and develop over the coming years. If you haven't yet seen the trees, you are welcome to don your wellies and have a look!





Ladysmith Football Tournament


