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Ladysmith G.R.O.W. Update

The G.R.O.W. Project was started last year following the rebuild of the school in order to improve the grounds for the children. In consultation with Mr Wilkinson, Mr Broad and Mr Hawkins, the project is run by volunteers led by Catherine Davis, a mum to a former student. We have raised funds through donations, fundraising events such as Clip and Climb and through applying, and being awarded, grants.

The project so far:

- Collection of items e.g. tyres, dressing up clothes, for loose play.
- Re-establishing the woodland area with a new path and a seating area for teachers.
- Building the sandpit and pebble pit area with boats and jetty.
- o Laying path and gardens from the Pretoria Road entrance up to the playground.
- Laying stone circle

Project Plan for September/October 2018

Woodland Area:

- More planting
- Move benches
- Put down weed suppressant fabric
- Reduce size of flower bed

Wellbeing Garden:

- Add soil to new raised bed and plant up
- Prepare labyrinth area by moving cobbles from front of school
- Install reflecting pool with wire grate, pebbles and water
- Plant up circular garden
- Get quotes from carpenters for octagonal pergola
