The test will be done during the school day on April 27th or April 30th.




Any Reception and Year 1 parents who do not want this screening to be given to their child please remember to return the 'opt out' slip on your letter duly completed and signed.

SUMMER IS HERE!!!

During the hot summer weather, we advise that children bring in hats to wear outside. Sun screen should be clearly marked with your child's name. The teachers cannot apply the sun cream. Please double check the ingredients and make sure it has no nut traces! We suggest you provide your child with either sun screen wipes or Boots Soltan Once Spray which parents can spray on their children before school and their child will be protected all day. Both these products make it easier for your child to apply the protection themselves.

It is also **essential** that children have appropriate outdoor seasonal wear.


