Taiko Drumming

Jonathan Kirby, director of Kagemusha Taiko, kindly lent us 10 taiko drums following the year 3 taiko sessions we ran before Christmas. His request was that Ladysmith perform at the taiko festival on 3rd July as part of the junior performance night at the Northcott, with groups performing from around the UK.

We have a committed group of players who practise every week, and we are lucky to have a taiko player Dawn Colgan and teacher Jan Howe help run the sessions. Jan and Dawn have been writing a new piece for our performance, and the children have been engaged, enthusiastic and quick to learn taiko skills.

Kagemusha are providing theatre seats for the children but parents can purchase tickets from the Northcott website for the Friday. There is a whole weekend of taiko, with international taiko stars playing on the Saturday. There are also usually free workshops and performances over the weekend. The junior performance evening is inspiring and there are usually a few tears from the audience.

We are hoping that Ladysmith will continue to develop the relationship with Kagemusha Taiko following the festival. They are a great resource in our locality, and have supported us in bringing taiko to school.
