Refugee Workshop

Recently, Mr Edwards, a parent of a child in year 3, spoke to the children in 6NM about what had inspired him to travel to Calais and help refugees. He told us stories of how the volunteers had worked together to build shelters. It was great to hear about the kindness shown by the volunteers and of the refugees towards each other.

Many of the refugees were from northern Iraq and Afghanistan: Mr Edwards told the children of his experiences of their culture, of how they shared their skills and resources to support each other. Mr Edwards will be visiting the other year 6 classes to share his experiences. He is currently visiting the refugee camp again. The children asked if there was anything we could do to help and Mr Edwards explained the need for donations of clothing in particular. If you are able to donate any hoodies, jeans, strong shoes or waterproof coats, they would be greatly appreciated. Donations should be in very good condition. Any donations should be brought to reception and will be added to Mr Edward's next visit or given to a charity which supports refugees.


