# **Dressing Up**

Some children felt quite strongly about this, so Mr Wilkinson talked to the whole school about it in assembly and then worked with the School Council to show them how democracy works by holding a whole school referendum about the issue.

The children were given three choices: to celebrate World Book Day by dressing up as book characters; to fundraise on Red Nose Day by wearing red; or to dress up in red for Red Nose Day and allow children to fundraise in different ways in their class during the afternoon.

The children voted overwhelmingly for option 3, so will be discussing ideas with their teachers about what they could do in their class as a fundraiser.

We will still be having our book swap on Thursday as planned, so don't forget to bring in any books you're prepared to swap to the library on Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday next week and pick up your swap token.

#### **Mobile Phones in School**

We would prefer children not to bring mobile phones to school, and the school policy is that if your child has an exceptional reason to bring a phone it needs to be kept in a named pouch in the Drop Box in the School Office.

We will also only accept a phone for the Drop Box if a parent has signed a permission form in which they take responsibility for the phone. You can get one of these from the School Office. We do not have the capacity to store lots of phones, so please only use this facility in exceptional circumstances.

If your child brings in a phone and does not place it in the Drop Box it will be confiscated and put in the box. It can then be collected at the end of the school day.

### **Tree Planting**

All of the Junior School children will be planting a tree to contribute to our Federation Hedge on Monday. They will be outside for about half an hour, and will therefore need to bring suitable waterproofs and either wellies or other mudproof footwear.

The hedge will be a haven for wildlife, and will also grow into a much more attractive boundary for the school field than the current chain link fence.

We would like to thank Councillor Richard
Westlake who has very kindly donated the money
to buy the trees, and the Devon Wildlife Trust for
providing the expertise and volunteers to make it
happen.
