#### Application for Infant/ Primary/Junior School – September 2018

If your child was born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2013 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2014 (inclusive) you need to be thinking about applying for infant/primary school. The application process for primary places opened on 15 November 2017 and will close on 15 January 2018.

Please make sure you complete an Admission Form online. Admissions to schools are not automatic – every place has to be applied for regardless of what school you would prefer.



www.devon.gov.uk/admissionsonline. Applications made after 15<sup>th</sup> January 2018 will be classed as late and may lead to disappointment due to all the places being filled. If you cannot apply online, you will be able to apply using a hard copy of the common application form. If you require a hard copy of the application form please contact the Education Helpline on 0345 155 1019. Please note that it will not be possible to make an application by email. Your child must be in full-time education at the beginning of the term following his or her fifth birthday. This would be at a school unless you decide to educate at home, in which case you should contact Admissions for further advice. Any queries should be directed to Devon County Council Admissions on 0345 155 1019.

This also applies to our Year 2 children who will be joining Junior Schools in September. Please make sure you complete an Admission Form online. Admissions to schools are not automatic – every place has to be applied for regardless of what school you would prefer. www.devon.gov.uk/admissionsonline.

#### Lost Property

As the end of the term is approaching please check lost property. We have a mound of various clothing items (including coats!) again this term. Remembering to name **ALL** clothing would help enormously and if your child should come home wearing the wrong sweat shirt or fleece, please return it to the class teacher. Please remember to name **all** items and encourage your child to look after them.

We have set up a fundraising account with Stikins which means that any orders made will benefit the school. Letters will go home next week with details of how to order. The company was recommended by a parent who already uses them and says they are really good!

Stick-on name labels for clothing and personal items - name labels that simply stick on and stay on - no sewing and no ironing needed!

#### Keeping Our Children Safe.....

#### At home.....

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has been exposed to, or involved in, any domestic incident.



Operation Encompass will ensure that a member of the school staff, known as a Key Adult, is trained to allow them to liaise with the police and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, while ensuring that the school is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have been involved in, or exposed to, a domestic abuse incident.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.



#### Do You Qualify?

We understand that there are many pressures on families and financial pressure is one of them. We would like to encourage parents to take up the opportunity to register for "Free School Meals" if you meet the criteria below. Although you will know that all children in the Infant School have a free lunch, this registration brings additional benefits. You may carry memories from your own childhood of "free school meal" children being distinguishable from others by having to carry a different coloured ticket to lunch or stand apart from others. At Ladysmith Infant and Nursery there is nothing that distinguishes a child who has a free school meal from others. Once registered and in receipt of the "Pupil Premium Grant" parents may be able to claim back the cost of a jumper, trip, or club.

The school will also benefit from an additional amount which is used to improve what we do for our children. With huge pressure on budgets, registration for Free School Meals entitles your child to the Pupil Premium Grant and gives the school £1320 extra per year.

If you meet the criteria:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance (JSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided the parents are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on, which is paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax credit
- Universal Credit
