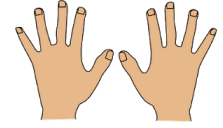


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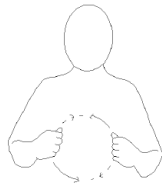




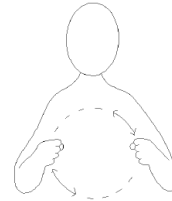
Signs of the Week

Dear Parents / Carers,

Are you interested in training to become a primary school teacher?

We are pleased to be able to offer members of our school community the opportunity to train to become primary teachers through Exeter Consortium and Teaching School Alliance (ECTSA).

Exeter Consortium is a growing group of schools in and around Exeter, all working to improve the quality of learning for our pupils. Working in partnership with your child's school, ECTSA are training the next generation of teachers, improving the quality of teaching, raising the attainment of pupils and closing the gap between different groups of pupils.

Being able to attract talented people into the teaching profession is vitally important as we know it makes such a difference to the quality of education for our children; and what better place to start than our own community!

This opportunity is possible through the teacher training route called 'School Direct', led by Exeter Consortium. More and more, people are training through the School Direct route because it allows you to train close to home, is a 'hands-on' learning experience and is guided by practising teachers working in real-life classrooms. With Exeter Consortium, you achieve Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) and a Post Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) from Bath Spa University, an Outstanding provider of Initial Teacher Training.

How does the course work? The course takes one year to complete and starts in September 2019. You would spend three days a week at your placement school (one of our 60 Primary Schools in and around Exeter) completing your teaching practice, and two days a week receiving training from Exeter Consortium and Bath Spa. You undertake a second contrasting placement in another school during the Spring term.

We would be very interested to hear from you if you are thinking of becoming a teacher. We are looking for people who have (or will have) a degree, have a passion for teaching and want to inspire young people to fulfil their potential.
