Sustrans Bike Project

We are excited to announce that we are beginning a project with Sustrans to encourage more children to travel to school on foot and by bike and scooter. Helen from Sustrans will be coming in to talk to the children in assembly on the first day back after half term to introduce some of the exciting events coming up. On Monday 30th October (the first day back after half term) we will be hosting 'Dr Bike' which is a mobile bike checking service. Dr Bike will check the childrens bikes, completing a 'health check' on the bikes, looking at gears and brakes etc.



If you would like your bike checked, just park your bike in the shelter and attach a tag to your bike which will be available on the morning.

On **Wednesday 1st November**, we will be holding a 'Bike to School' day where we would like as many children (and grownups!) to ride their bikes or scooters to school.

It was great to see so many of the children's grown-ups in school on Wednesday at our open evening. We loved seeing how proud the children were of their work and the progress they have already made.

Year 4 Story Telling

We often speak to the children about the prupose of their writing and in particular who their 'audience' is. This can have a huge impact on their writing as they need to plan their writing with the reader in mind. Year 4 have been writing stories to share with year 1 children; on Friday, they spent time at the Infant School reading to the younger children. It was amazing to see how engaged the younger children were and how proud year 4 were to show off their work.



Ladysmith GROW Project

We would like to say a huge thank you to Catherine Davis who has given up a great deal of her own time to help to launch the Ladysmith GROW (**G**ardening, **R**ecreation, **O**utdoor learning and **W**ellbeing), project which aims to develop the school grounds into a *'vibrant, safe learning environment where teachers and children can maximise the use of the school grounds for learning and play'*. With involvement from the Devon Wildlife Trust, we are developing a detailed plan for the site and Catherine has had some amazing ideas and we can already see the space beginning to take shape. After half term, we will be asking children and parents for their ideas on how the space could be developed. Look out for details in upcoming newsletters.

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Learning Letters

SOE3 Forms

We have sent home hard copies of SOE3 forms today. These forms act as consent for local walking trips and provide us with up-to-date information about your child which is needed in school and on trips. Please return these as soon as possible after half term.

Boots Opticians

There is powerful evidence of the value of having early screening checks on children, and many conditions that are detected in young children can be corrected. We will continue to lead for the critical importance of proactive eye health for children and offer a basic visual acuity check for children via our Zookeeper Zoe e-book <u>https://www.zookeeperzoe.co.uk</u> in which parents/carers and teachers can work through the screening check. This vision screening check includes the following checks:

- Astigmatism check (shape of the eye and focus ability)
- Colour vision check (how well different colours are distinguished)
- Duo chrome check (ability to focus correctly)
- Visual acuity check (accuracy and sharpness of vision)



We would always encourage any parents, carers or teachers who are concerned about a child's eye health to visit their local optometrist who will be able to a full eye check, no matter the child's age.
