## **All Weather Clothing**

We need all children to have a named pair of wellies in school. Our usual stocks of wellies, coats and trousers can't be shared between children and so we are asking all parents to provide a pair for their children, to be kept in school. This will enable us to get outside whatever the weather. Your child will also need a named, waterproof coat and waterproof trousers.

Some families may have old wellies and waterproofs that children have grown out of that they may like to donate to school. If you have pairs to give, please drop them off outside the office window and we will make sure that another child benefits from them.
