We had a visit from Roisin from the NSPCC who led an assembly to give our children information about how to keep themselves safe from harm and how to get help if they have any worries, sensitively discussing issues like bullying and sexual abuse, without using scary words or adult language.

The NSPCC's work in schools will help encourage conversations about staying safe – and they have a number of child-friendly materials to

help you carry on the conversation afterwards. This includes 'The Underwear Rule', a simple way for parents to help keep children safe – without using scary words.

The guide uses the rules of PANTS to teach children that their body belongs to them and them alone. You can find out more and download free resources at **nspcc.org.uk/pants**


Lost Property
