Staying Safe on the Roads

On Monday we had a visit from Emily from the Child Brain Injury Trust. Her assembly to KS1 children helped them to understand how important it is to look after your brain. As part of this, the children learned 6 ways to stay safe on the roads. Hopefully the children will remember some of them if you ask them! If not here is the list:

- Wear reflective or bright clothing
- Use a pedestrian crossing
- Wear a helmet if on a bike or skateboard
- Use a car seat until you are 12 years old
- Don't distract the driver when in a car
- Remember to wear your seatbelt

Application for Infant/ Primary School – September 2019



If your child was born between 1st September 2014 and 31st August 2015 (inclusive) you need to be thinking about applying for school. The application process for primary places opened on 15 November 2018 and will close on 15 January 2019.

Please make sure you complete an Admission Form online. **Admissions to schools are not automatic** – every place has to be applied for regardless of what school you would prefer.

www.devon.gov.uk/admissionsonline. Applications made after 15th January 2019 will be classed as late and may lead to disappointment due to all the places being filled.

Remembering to name **ALL** clothing would help enormously and if your child should come home wearing the wrong sweat shirt or fleece, please return it to the class teacher. Please remember to name **all** items and encourage your child to look after them.
