
This includes free online productions and the Theatre Alibi Exchange encourages children to create something, such as a poem, puppet, film or dance and in exchange the company will make something to send back.

Take Five

Parenting Hints & Tips from Sandy Williams (Family Support Worker) & Helen Keenor (SENDCO).

- 1. Watch one (or more) of Mrs Pearce's video clips about feelings/emotions.
- 2. Do some water painting all you need is a paint brush, sponge, or a scrunched up old cloth, and some water. Use the water to 'paint' patterns on a wall, the garden fence, paving stones etc. This is definitely an outdoor activity!
- 3. Put some dried pasta or rice into a large bowl, and hide small objects in it. You could make it a bit more interesting by giving each item a certain number of points, and see who can get the most.
- 4. Use dried pasta to make jewellery for each other by threading or tying it onto wool or string. You could paint, or colour it with felt-tip pens.
- 5. Try blowing a ping pong ball, or scrunched up piece of paper across the table, or floor. See who can be first to cross the finish line!

Free School Meals - During Summer Holiday Period

Children in England who are eligible for free school meals will receive a **six-week food voucher to cover the summer holiday period worth £90**, after a campaign by Manchester United and England footballer Marcus Rashford.

Please refer to the Department for Education guidance here.

We strongly recommend that, if you think you may qualify, you complete a quick application online to check whether you are eligible for this funding via the <u>Devon Citizens Portal</u>.

If you complete this check in the next 5 working days and qualify, you will receive a £90 food voucher before the end of term. Your child will also receive assistance with school trips and potentially secure free school dinners when joining the Junior school.

If you apply and you receive confirmation you are eligible, please take a screen shot of the message you receive and email it to infant.admin@ladysmithfederation.net.
