Get set... we're taking part in Sustrans Big Pedal 2018, the UK's largest interschool cycling and scooting challenge that inspires pupils, staff and parents to choose two wheels for their journey to school.

The challenge runs from 23rd April to 4th May. It's free to enter and we would love everyone to be involved.

The details

On each day of the challenge schools compete to see who can record the greatest number of pupils, staff and parents cycling or scooting to school. We'll be competing against other schools right across the UK, and if we clock up the most bike and scooter journeys we'll win!

Events

Thursday 26th May – lunchtime bike skills: Bring in your bike and sign up for bike skills sessions. Places are limited to 18 so if more than 18 sign up, places will be allocated at random.

Week beginning 30th April – Turbo Trainer: All week, there will be a turbo trainer available and children and staff will work together to ride as far as we can over the course of the week. Parents wishing to take part can have a go after school any day!
