We were so pleased that our visit to Ladysmith Junior School last Wednesday afternoon was so well received. From our point of view we were made to feel very welcome by both staff and pupils alike. We were impressed by the way in which the children came into the hall, their attention and concentration and the enthusiasm with which they participated.

They had obviously been well prepared and interacted keenly with the music being played and responded really well to questions with thoughtful answers and observations. For some of the children it was probably the first time they had heard a live string quartet, or heard a double bass or oboe being played live, or seen and held historic musical instruments and it was rewarding to see such interest.

We were further impressed by the pupils' own performance of the 'body percussion' piece - a great way of showing them that everyone has the ability to perform.

The feedback concerning our visit has been extremely rewarding for us and it is heartening to think that in some small way we may have encouraged the children to become actively involved in making music for themselves.



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
