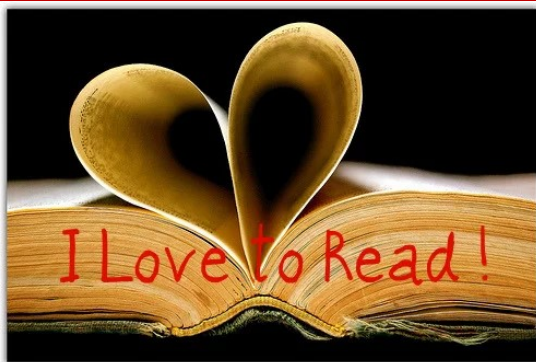
Pop-Up Café!
