Critical Workers and Vulnerable Pupil Places

As you will be aware, school is still open for children of critical workers or vulnerable children. We are trying to keep the number of children in school to a manageable level for a number of reasons. The first and foremost of these is the safety of our whole school community. The new variant of Covid 19 has been shown to be highly transmissible and by reducing the number of children in school, we hope to minimise any infection within our school community. With this in mind, please do not be offended if you receive a call from a member of school staff to check your critical worker status or to ask about your circumstances. They may also need to call your employment. It may be that we are not able to offer some children places and have to put them on a waiting list. I understand that this is frustrating but please work with us in these difficult times.

Remote Learning

Over the Federation, we have a range of tools to deliver remote learning to the children at home, depending upon their Key Stage. We feel that these plat-forms all offer something different that is appropriate and accessible for children in the different age ranges.

There is an expectation that children will complete remote learning and participate in live calls or activities where possible. We understand that this is not always easy with device sharing and other day to day issues when you are trying to manage several things at home at once. Please do not be offended if we call to see how things are or to see if you are having technical problems if we have not seen or heard from your child on remote learning.

If you have any questions or problems with the remote learning, please contact your child's teacher in the first instance if possible. If you need further help, please contact a member of the leadership team named above.



<u>Testing</u>

When to get a test

If you have symptoms, get a test as soon as possible.

Book a visit to a test site to have the test today. Test sites are open 7 days a week. Order a home test kit if you cannot get to a test site.

England and Northern Ireland

You need to get the test done in the first 8 days of having symptoms.

On days 1 to 7, you can get tested at a site or at home. If you're ordering a home test kit on day 7, do it by 3pm.

On day 8, you need to go to a test site - it's too late to order a home test kit
