NSPCC Speak Out; Stay safe

Kerry and Betty from the NSPCC came in to speak to us about their Speak out, stay safe campaign. The children were introduced to Buddy who is shaped as a speech bubble. We explored lots of things that children might worry about such as hearing scary stories, people you love dying, seeing scary films.

We explored neglect, physical abuse, emotional abuse, sexual abuse and bullying and what these things might look like for children.

We were reminded that abuse is not ok and we need to 'speak out, stay safe'.

The children had lots of ideas for who they could talk to if they are worried about anything to do with staying safe. Whilst it is good to talk to friends and siblings, it is important to talk to a trusted adult as they will be able to make changes that are needed.
